



LSU Bogalusa Medical Center Receives Louisiana Hospital Capstone Quality Award

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Bogalusa – LSU Bogalusa Medical Center (BMC), in Bogalusa, La., received the 2010 Louisiana Hospital Capstone Quality Award, presented by eQHealth Solutions, the Medicare Quality Improvement Organization for Louisiana.

LSU BMC is one of only 38 hospitals in Louisiana to receive this award, which recognizes BMC for achieving certain improvements in the quality of healthcare it gives to its patients.

“We implement quality improvement initiatives because they allow us to deliver to our patients the best practices in healthcare,” said Kurt Scott, LSU BMC CEO. “We take advantage of every opportunity to ensure our patients benefit from the latest advances in medicine. This award recognizes our ongoing efforts to serve our patients as best as we can.”

Aligned with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services inpatient quality initiatives, the Louisiana Hospital Capstone Quality Awards recognize hospital achievement in appropriate care for patients with diagnoses of acute myocardial infarction, heart failure, community acquired pneumonia and improvements in care related to measures outlined in the Surgical Care Improvement Project.

CMS has designated the clinical measure sets for the awards as national healthcare priorities. Quality improvement teams at LSU BMC have worked to use evidence-based practices to improve care for their patients.

Previously titled the Louisiana Hospital Quality Awards, the Louisiana Hospital Capstone Quality Awards were announced at the 2011 Louisiana Medicare Quality Summit, hosted by eQhealth Solutions, in Baton Rouge.
